#### From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings!

For those of you who were unable to attend the Ash Wednesday service I would like to share the message I gave. And for those who attended I would like you to reflect on that message.

#### FOR MY SINS!

Mark 15:21-39

At the ninth hour, Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Jesus was forsaken by the crowd who on Palm Sunday shouted "Hosanna, hosanna, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." And only five days later they were shouting, "Crucify him, crucify him!"

It is so easy to want to go right from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday. It is so easy to want to go right from hosanna to He is risen. However, to fully understand the suffering Jesus endured, to fully understand the that God has for us; we need to stop—we need to stop at the foot of the cross. We will never experience the elation of the resurrection, until we experience the agony of the cross.

It was time for Jesus to be crucified. He had been beaten. He had been flogged. His flesh was bleeding, raw and torn open. A crown of thorns pierced Jesus' skull. Then spikes were driven through his wrists and feet. At the sixth hour, darkness came over the whole land. And that was when Jesus cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Darkness came upon the earth. The light was gone. Sin crushed the perfect, unblemished lamb. The pain of the cross; the nails, the tortured flesh was agonizing; but the most agonizing pain of was when the Father turned his back on his Son.

Jesus took our sins and paid the price for each of us. The price was separation from his Father. That was the first and last time that Jesus would be separated from his Father. What agony it was for Jesus. He cried out to his Father, "Why have you forsaken me?"

#### From the Pastor's Desk (continued)

As I reflect on the suffering and death of Jesus, it reminds me of this true story.

It was a Sunday evening service in a small church. That night one of the local nursing homes, which cares for a group of adults with Downs Syndrome, brought several of their residents to worship. Some in the church may have been distracted by their outbursts, laughter and untimely 'amens.' But it was so impressive and amazing to see their simple childlike faith and their genuine excitement for hearing God's word.

When it came time for communion, they gathered at the altar and the pastor began to give the elements to each person that came forward. The residents from the nursing home came forward to receive the elements. When the Pastor offered bread to one of the men with downs syndrome, he said; "The Body of Christ, given for you." Then he gave the man the cup with juice and said, "The blood of Christ, shed for you for the forgiveness of your sin." Upon hearing those words, the man blurted out, "For MY sins? For MY sins?"

It was as though he had been given a precious gift. The man in his simple childlike faith truly understood the words spoken by the pastor. But they weren't the pastor's words; they were the words of Christ. They were words of forgiveness, hope, good news and salvation. That night, the young man with the faith of a child believed. He believed the words of Christ and as a result he realized that HIS sins had been forgiven. The man with downs syndrome preached a joyous three-word sermon that night. **FOR MY SINS!** 

Brothers and sisters in Christ, during this Lenten season, take time to reflect on the great price paid so that your sins could be forgiven. Let's all journey together to the cross where Christ willingly went to pay the price **FOR YOUR SINS** and **FOR MY SINS!**

## CHURCH WORLD SERVICE BLANKET DRIVE — EXTENDED



#### **JUST FOR FUN**



Use your voice and this hand-crafted percussion instrument to make joyful noises to the Lord.

#### What you need:

- Dry beans (about one Tbsp)
- Plastic Easter egg
- 2 plastic spoons
- Masking tape
- Markers and stickers

#### What you do:

- 1. Place the beans inside the egg and snap it closed.
- 2. Set the egg in a spoon and cover it with the second spoon so the spoons are holding the egg.
- 3. Tape the spoons to the egg. Also wrap tape around the spoons from top to bottom to make a shaker handle.
- 4. Decorate your shaker and use it as you sing praises to God.
- 5. Experiment with sounds by filling other eggs with coins, rice, and so on.
