If you have been by the community center, perhaps you have noticed the new "manual" message board. It was installed in early March by Custom Signs, Inc. of

Grove City. It has the center's name at the top and our phone number at the bottom and the same amount of signage area as the old sign which was in dire need of replacement. The total cost for the sign was \$1763,00 which included installation with Sakrete to hold the posts and removal and disposal of the old sign. We were able to get a grant from the Beaver-Butler Presbytery for half of that cost(\$881.50) and the remainder was paid for from memorial money for Jim Keith and a family member of Bill and Flora Jones.






JUST FOR FUN



Make this snack necklace to enjoy during summer travels.




- Dental floss
