#### MISSION UPDATES



School Kits: It's August and that means back to school and this is the month in which the Friendship Presbyterian Women gather school supplies and pack school kits for Church World Service. We ask for donations of blunt scissors, notebooks (70 page count),

12" rulers, hand held pencil sharpeners, unsharpened pencils with erasers, boxes of 24 crayons. For the artistic, bags with be on the table that can be decorated....just no camouflage or wording. All items Kits will be needed by Sunday, September 6 or bring to the Presbyterian Women's meeting on Wednesday, September 9.

Watch for the sign up sheet for donations coming soon.

Hygiene Kits: Our Presbyterian Women's Group also collects hygiene kits for World Church Service in September. If you are willing, you are asked to make a kit. You will need 1 hand towel 15"x28" to 16"x32"(no fingertip,. dishtowel or micro fiber), 1 washcloth, 1 wide-tooth comb with at least 6 inches of teeth removed from packaging (no pocket combs or picks), 1 fingernail or toenail clipper also removed from packaging, 1 bath size bar of soap, 1 toothbrush in original package, 10 standard size bandaids. All items need to fit inside a one-gallon Ziploc type bag. Remove excess air and seal. Do not add extra items including toothpaste.

Kits will be needed by Sunday, September 6 or bring to the Presbyterian Women's meeting on Wednesday, September 9.

CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL: The Children's Sunday school class continues to meet in the preschool classroom with social distancing measures observed.




#### **ON-LINE SERVICES CONTINUE**

#### What you need:


- Masking tape
- Large craft sticks
- Paper plates
- Balloons
- Ribbon
- Scissors
- Green construction paper
- Craft glue

#### What you do:

**Balloon Badminton:** Make rackets by taping a stick "handle" to each plate. Blow up and tie a balloon. Use the rackets to pass the balloon back and forth, without letting it touch the floor.

Rhythmic Routines: Using tape, firmly attach one end of a 4-foot ribbon to a craft stick. Display style and skill by waving it around. Try choreographing a routine to a praise song.

Champion Crown: Cut a large hole out of the center of a paper plate. Cut 2-inch ovals from green paper. Glue those "leaves" to the ring as garland. Crown a winner of each game!
