A Little History....

Every Sunday we sing "Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow," also known as "The Doxology." This was written in 1674 by Englishman Thomas Ken. As a youngster he attended Winchester College, an historic boys' school. He was later ordained to the ministry and became a chaplain at Winchester.

Wanting to encourage the boys in their devotional habits, he wrote 3 hymns in 1674...a revolutionary event as English hymns had not yet appeared. Only Psalms were sung in public worship. The boys were to use these hymns privately in their rooms. There was a hymn to sing upon waking, one to sing at bedtime, and one to sing a midnight.


All 3 of these hymns concluded with a common stanza, the same one we sing every week in response to the offering. It has become the most widely-sung verse in the world. I wonder how many times I have sung these words in my lifetime.

"Praise God from whom all blessings flow, Praise Him, all creatures here below, Praise Him above, ye heavenly host, Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Amen."

Protestants recall the Reformation on October 31. On that day in 1517, Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses on a church door in Wittenberg, Germany.



Ultimately, the following five statements of belief became central to Protestant Christians.

- 1. Scripture alone is the final authority of Christian doctrine.
- 2. Christ alone is Lord and Savior.
- 3. God's freely given grace is central to salvation.
- 4. Sinners are justified by faith in Christ alone.
- 5. God alone is worthy of all the glory.

A PRAYER FOR PUMPKIN PEOPLE

After Liz Curtis Higgs wrote the popular children's book The Pumpkin Patch Parable, people began using her analogies to say a prayer while carving their Halloween pumpkins. The pumpkin prayer, a Christian alternative to Halloween traditions, reminds people of all ages what God has done for us. Use it this fall when your family makes jack-o'-lanterns.

• While cutting off the top of the pumpkin, pray, "Lord, open my mind so I can learn new things about you." (See Proverbs 1:7.)



• While removing the seeds and pulp, pray, "Remove the things in my life that don't please you. Forgive the wrong things I do, and help me forgive others." (See Matthew 6:14-15.)



• While making eyes, pray, "Open my eyes to see the beauty you've made in the world around me." (See Psalm 104:24.)



 While making the nose, pray, "I'm sorry for the times I've turned up my nose at your many gifts." (See James 1:17.)



• While making the mouth, pray, "Let everything I say please you." (See Psalm 19:14.)



• While lighting the candle, pray, "Lord, help me show your light to others through the things I do." (See Matthew 5:16.)



After carving your pumpkins, display them as examples of how God's love transforms us into new creations.

World Communion Sunday, celebrated this year on October I, reminds us there's no such thing as solitary Christianity. "As Christians we're called to belong, not just to believe," writes Rick Warren. "We are not meant to live lone-ranger lives; instead, we are to belong to Christ's family and be members of his body."

After all, Christian fellowship can't occur without fellow Christians. We can't learn the intricacies of the Bible and theology without preachers and teachers. We don't baptize ourselves. We don't take Holy Communion alone; in fact, the sacrament's very name refers to interaction with God and others.

The New Testament clearly states that one cannot be Christian all alone. We are members of Christ's body (Ephesians 5:30). We belong to the family of believers (Galatians 6:10). We are "a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people" (1 Peter 2:9, NRSV).


As always, refreshments start at 6:30 p.m. and the concert will begin promptly at 7:00 p.m. (Members are asked to bring along a dessert or snack to share.)

JUST FOR FUN


An important part of missions is prayerfully supporting the church. Use this activity to guide your family's prayer time.

What you need:

- Plastic bag (large zippered)
- Permanent marker
- Bandage
- Toy plane
- Heart-shaped drawing or toy
- Spoon
- Coin
- Hot-sauce packet

What you do:

- 1. Label the bag with details about the missionaries you'll be praying for (names, location, specific needs).
- 2. Add small prayer-prompt objects to guide your prayer time (bandage = health, plane = travel, heart = relationships, spoon = cultural connection, coin = finances, hot sauce = boldness).
- 3. Include other objects that will prompt prayer for missionaries' specific needs.
- 4. Place the bag where it will remind your family to pray regularly.
