This is a true story about a nine-year-old boy who lived in a rural town in Tennessee. His house was in a poor section of the community. The local church had a bus ministry that come knocking on his door one Saturday afternoon. The boy came to the door and greeted the pastor. The pastor asked if the boy's parents were home. They were away for the weekend and the boy was home alone. They went into the living room and sat down on an old, worn sofa. The pastor asked him where he went to church. shiny, metal plates. The men walked up and down the aisles passing the shiny plates. All of a sudden it hit him what was taking place. The people were giving money to Jesus. The boy remembered what Jesus had done for him and he wanted to give to Jesus also. He searched in his pockets, but he couldn't find anything to give Jesus. By this time the offering plate was being passed down his row. With a broken heart he grabbed the plate and held on. Finally, he let go. His eyes remained glued to the plate as it was passed back and forth until it made its way to the back of the sanctuary.

Then the boy had an idea. That little nine-year-old boy, in front of God and everyone, got up out of his seat and walked to the back of the sanctuary. He grabbed the usher and asked if he could hold the plate once more. Then he did the most amazing thing. He took the plate, sat it on the floor and stepped into it. As he stood there, he lifted his head and said these words, "Jesus, I don't have anything to give you today...BUT ME! I give you me!"

This Christmas, shouldn't we give God what he wants? Look in the mirror and give God what he wants. After all, it is his Son's birthday!!

- Glitter


