Per Capita is an annual per member apportionment (\$42.90 for 2022) that funds presbytery, synod, and general assembly efforts.

\$31.52 annual contribution to support Presbytery infrastructure necessary for mission in Beaver and Butler Counties

\$2.40 annual contribution to the Synod, which consists of 16 Presbyteries across Pennsylvania and parts of West Virginia and Ohio

\$8.98 annual contribution to the Office of General Assembly, which supports our Synods, Presbyteries, and over 10,000 congregations.


