The Children's Sunday school class is learning about people from the Old Testament and how they parallel with people from the New Testament. We meet in the basement at 9:45 a.m. each week.



Writer and civil rights activist James Baldwin stated: "You think your pain and heartbreak are unprecedented ... but then you read. Books taught me that the things that tormented me the most were the very things that connected me with all the people who were alive or who had ever been alive." Whether through books or direct human interaction, we often learn that our suffering connects us to other people and that our pain gains meaning by moving us to support someone else who's hurting.

Paul writes of such connection: "Praise be to ... the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God" (2 Corinthians 1:3-4, NIV). May you share the comfort you have received from God with others in þain.

As a bonus, along the way you'll realize you're not — and never have been — alone.
