
SUNDAY SCHOOL UPDATE

MISSION UPDATES



The mission projects for August and September for our Presbyterian Women and our church are school and health kits for Church World Service. CWS reports a greater need this year, perhaps "greater than they've been in recent history." The past few years have left more people in need following disasters. Families around the word are fleeing violence and harsh climates.



School Kits: Items needed for are blunt scissors, 70 page count notebooks (35 cents at Walmart), 30 centimeter/12" rulers, hand-held pencil sharpeners, large erasers, unsharpened pencils w/eraser, 24 count boxes of crayons, (We have enough pencils left over from last year.)

There is a sign-up sheet for donations of these items in the vestibule. We will pack these kits at the September PW meeting, Sept. 14th.

In addition we will need medium-sized cardboard boxes to pack the kits. The packages can not weigh more than 30 pounds so they cannot be large boxes. We also need a volunteer to take the boxed to Zelienople the first week of October.



Health/Hygiene Kits can be made by anyone wishing to do so. Items needed for each kit are: 1 hand towel(15"x28" to 16"x32", no micro-fiber), 1 washcloth, 1 wide tooth comb removed from packaging (at least 6"long), 1 fingernail or toenail clipper removed from packaging, 1 bath size bar of soap in original packaging, 1 toothbrush in original package, 10 standard sized band-aids. All items must be packed inside a onegallon size Ziploc type bag with excess air removed. If you don't normally use that size or type of bag, ask Ruth for one instead of buying a box. Toothpaste will be added to the kit by CWS. These are also due at Sept. 14th meeting.





FPC session has established a monthly donation of \$100 to Trevor Wood's H20 Akron Intern Program. H20 has been ministering to campus students around Ohio for over 30 years. H20 Akron began ministering on the University of Akron campus in 2014. Trevor is exploring the possibility of working full-time in campus ministry after graduation. This Intern Program is the first step in this process. The session is proud to be a part of his journey. If you are interested in giving to this program on a personal level, you may place your donation in the offering plate (be sure to mark it "Trevor Wood Program.") That money will then be forwarded along with our monthly donation.

God Among the Rubble

The nonprofit World Central Kitchen provides fresh meals for communities in need following natural disasters or during humanitarian crises. After Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022, WCK fed millions of people in the country and refugees at border crossings.

When I feel discouraged by tragic news and ask where God is, I'm reminded that God shows up precisely in people such as the WCK teams. They are God's hands serving healthy food to people fleeing home. They are God's heart and arms welcoming those in need to be nourished.

Often in the Bible God shows up around meals: Sarah and Abraham host the Lord in the form of three visitors; God rains manna from heaven for the Israelites; an angel provides food for exhausted Elijah; Jesus eats with "tax collectors and sinners" and feeds crowds with a few loaves and fish. Supremely, Jesus gives to all the meal of Holy Communion, the bread and wine that are his very body and blood.

In our broken world, God is among the rubble, among the helpers, among us.






