

Feed My Sheep Food Cupboard: We are currently collecting dessert mixes (cookies, cakes, etc.) and icing for 2 more weeks. Other food items are also welcome. Please put donations in container in vestibule. Watch for the next "item of the month."



All Good Things: We continue to collect any clothing items (men's, women's, children's). Also wanted are shoes, purses, and jewelry. A delivery is planned for mid-August.



CHURCH WORLD SERVICE: Friendship Presbyterian Women are collecting items for school kits and completed hygiene kits to be distributed around the world.

- SCHOOL KITS: Sign-up sheets will be in vestibule for donation of school kits items: blunt scissors, notebooks (70 page count), rulers, hand-held pencil sharpeners, large erasers, unsharpened pencils, crayons (24 count box). These items can be left in the vestibule by September 10 or brought to the FPW meeting on September 13.
- **HYGIENE KITS:** Each kit requires 1 hand towel, 1 washcloth, 1 wide-tooth comb (needs to be sturdy, have at least 6" of teeth, with or without handles, no pocket combs or picks), 1 fingernail or toenail clipper removed from packaging, 1 toothbrush in original package, 1 bath size bar of soap in packaging, and 10 standard size band-aids. Items should be packed in a 1 gallon size Ziploc type bag. Do not add toothpaste. These kits can also be left in the vestibule or brought to the FPW meeting on September 13 meeting.
- ALSO NEEDED: Some medium sized cardboard boxes for shipping. Contact Ruth with any questions.

We welcome **2B'S ACOUSTIC** to our stage for the first time for our **August 12, Second Saturday Concert.**




